# LOOKING FORWARD

BCHA was formed as a not for profit organisation in 1957 by a group of Bedford citizens who wanted to provide good quality rented accommodation for people unable to rent or buy elsewhere. The objectives listed in the archive documents chime well with the objectives today and BCHA's mission to house people in need stays very much the same.

BCHA Initially purchased existing properties and redeveloped them. Its first flats opened in 1958. Having noticed that many of their older residents needed care the organisation developed a purpose built care home which opened in 1969. In 1980 came a merger with Maydenbury Housing Association

and by 2007 BCHA was keen to develop new schemes which would help older people to age well in accommodation designed to meet their needs. Getting the land took a great deal of effort and time and the new Bedford Charter House was completed in 2015. This has been followed by the completion of Oak Way House, which was opened by Her Royal Highness Princess Alexandra on 27th July, this is an extra care housing scheme providing 42 flats for older people.

The £11 million re-development of the Kimbolton Road site over the previous four years has been a major achievement.

Having looked back over the last 60 years I look forward to building on this well-established legacy. BCHA will continue to

give the people of Bedford an opportunity to have a socially motivated landlord who delivers a service second to none and I recognise that like those who first formed BCHA we need to innovate and continue to deliver excellent services and value for money so we are able to help more people.
